Investigation Narrative

On July 27, 2018 at 1902 hours, Mike (732.890.1515) reported that a White male (later identified as [REDACTED] - age 33 of Ocean Gate) appeared to be overdosing on an unknown substance inside the Toms River Bus Terminal (400 Highland Parkway) Lobby. Upon arrival, [REDACTED] was seated on a chair inside the Lobby. Even though this individual was unconscious, he was responsive to tactile stimuli. Seven decks of heroin marked "drip" in blue lettering with a blue colored faucet image, along with a capped hypodermic needle, were located in [REDACTED] open cigarette pack. TR EMS responded to the scene and subsequently transported [REDACTED] to Community Medical Center's Emergency Room for medical treatment. The contraband was logged into TRPD Evidence, and the capped hypodermic needle was placed in the Department's sharps container. All of which are pending destruction.
