Incident: Overdose

Location: 1201 Hooper Ave; A Dollar Store

On 04/10/2018 at approximately 14:00 hours, Ptl. Malony and I responded to A Dollar Store in the Ocean County Mall for an overdose. Upon arrival, victim [REDACTED] was observed lying in the aisle of the store, surrounded by OCM Security.

A Dollar Store employees advised that they observed [REDACTED] standing in the aisle, leaning against a shelf for approximately fifteen minutes before eventually collapsing to the floor. [REDACTED] was found with agonal breathing, but with a pulse. TR EMS arrived on scene and administered four milligrams of Narcan to [REDACTED]. Once inside the ambulance, [REDACTED] regained consciousness.

Mixed with [REDACTED] belongings were several prescription pill bottles. Of note, a bottle of Tramadol that was filled on 04/02/2018 was found to have only four pills remaining. Per the bottle, [REDACTED] is only supposed to take a single pill each day. Although [REDACTED] would not disclose what he potentially took on this date, it is believed that [REDACTED] ingested too many of his Tramadol pills. [REDACTED] was transported to CMC for further treatment at this time. Nothing further.
