Incident: Overdose

Location: 1201 Hooper Ave; A Dollar Store

Victim:

On 04/10/2018 at approximately 14:00 hours, Ptl. Malony and I responded to A Dollar Store in the Ocean County Mall for an overdose. Upon arrival, victim was observed lying in the aisle of the store, surrounded by OCM Security.

A Dollar Store employees advised that they observed standing in the aisle, leaning against a shelf for approximately fifteen minutes before eventually collapsing to the floor. We was found with agonal breathing, but with a pulse. TR EMS arrived on scene and administered four milligrams of Narcan to Once inside the ambulance, regained consciousness.

Mixed with belongings were several prescription pill bottles. Of note, a bottle of Tramadol that was filled on 04/02/2018 was found to have only four pills remaining. Per the bottle, so only supposed to take a single pill each day. Although would not disclose what he potentially took on this date, it is believed that ingested too many of his Tramadol pills. Was transported to CMC for further treatment at this time. Nothing further.
