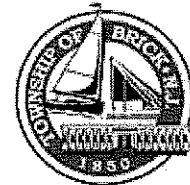

On December 12, 2018 at approximately 1502 hours, Ptl. Chadwick #281 and I responded to [redacted] for the report of an overdose victim.

EMS arrived on scene prior to our arrival and administered narcan to the victim later identified as [redacted]. It should be noted [redacted] gave EMS the remaining heroin he had from his right pocket.

On arrival, I observed the victim [redacted] in the living room sitting on the couch. [redacted] was conscious but looked fatigued and was slurring his words. [redacted] stated that he used 1 bag of heroin and he gave the remaining heroin in his possession to EMS. [redacted] advised this wasn't the first time it has happened.

I spoke to the caller [redacted], who stated she works at the address and [redacted] her son, was visiting her. [redacted] advised [redacted] exited the home at approximately 1420 hours, and met someone outside the home. [redacted] advised she did not see a vehicle or anyone outside when he exited. [redacted] stated he came back into the house about ten minutes later and sat on the couch. A few minutes later [redacted] found him unconscious on the couch turning blue and barely breathing.

[redacted] was loaded on to an ambulance and transported to Ocean Medical center for further evaluation.

The approximately 20 bags of heroin in wax folds with red thriller print on it was logged into property by Ptl. Chadwick. DEU Det. Alvarado #221 was notified at 1554 hours.

On 12/12/18 Ptl. Farnkopf #230 and I responded to the area of [redacted] in reference to the report of an unconscious subject that fell into the bushes. On arrival I spoke with the caller, [redacted], who is the owner of [redacted], stated his company is currently contracted to do cleanup work in the [redacted] area. [redacted] stated one of his employees, [redacted], showed up for work today and appeared to be under the influence of alcohol. [redacted] said [redacted] condition became increasingly worse throughout the day, to the point that [redacted] fell into bushes next to a residence and appeared to be unconscious and not responding. At that point [redacted] called 911, and Brick Police EMS responded to the scene where they transported [redacted] to Ocean Medical Center prior to officers arrival.

Ptl. Farnkopf and I responded to Ocean Medical Center where Brick Police EMS 534 advised us that they administered one dose (4 ML) of narcan. No CDS was located on [redacted] person or property. [redacted] was still intoxicated and uncooperative at the hospital. DEU was notified of the incident.

On December 4, 2018 at approximately 1023 hours Sgt. Rivaldo #179 and I responded to [redacted] in reference to an overdose.

Upon my arrival I was met by the caller [redacted] who advised that her friend [redacted] had overdosed. I entered the residence and observed [redacted] unconscious on the couch with his head slumped over to the left and vomit on himself. I further observed [redacted] eyes to be rolled back in his head and he was gurgling while trying to breath. I called out to [redacted] receiving no response. I administered one dose of Narcan and utilized a sternum rub multiple times while calling out to [redacted] still with no response. I then administered oxygen to [redacted] and after several minutes after Brick Police EMS arrived he began to become responsive, opening his, eyes and answering questions.

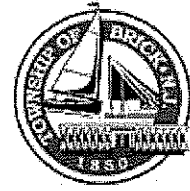
While [redacted] was being treated by EMS Sgt. Rivaldo collected 12 hypodermic syringes, approximately twenty to thirty wax folds of suspected heroin, some stamped in red with a skull wearing a crown that said "king of death" and some stamped in blue with "first lady," also located on scene was a glass pipe for suspected cocaine use, and two burnt spoons. The cds along with the paraphernalia was located on the bedroom dresser and in the top left drawer of the bedroom dresser. All evidence was collected and removed from the residence. The hypodermic syringes were brought to Ocean Medical Center and disposed of in the appropriate sharps container and the remaining contraband was taken to headquarters where it was logged and placed into property for destruction.

As Sgt. Rivaldo collected the contraband I spoke to [redacted] who stated she and [redacted] had gone to the store earlier in the day and that they have been just hanging out at his house. [redacted] explained that while she was in the kitchen [redacted] was in his bedroom and after a period of time he went and sat on the couch in the living room. [redacted] stated that she asked [redacted] if she could have a bottle of ensure from the refrigerator and she got no response. [redacted] walked into the living room and noticed [redacted] sitting on the couch slumped over to the left and she called out to him receiving no response. [redacted] stated she then entered his bedroom and observed the burnt spoons and hypodermic syringes on [redacted] dresser. [redacted], believing [redacted] overdosed, called 911.

Brick Police EMS transported [redacted] to Ocean Medical Center for further evaluation. I responded to the emergency room to speak further with [redacted] While at the hospital [redacted] stated he uses on and off and that he gets his heroin in Lakewood NJ, however, he was unable to provide any information in regards to who he gets it from. I asked [redacted] if he would be willing to speak to one of the drug detectives from this agency and he stated he would. I contacted Det. Alverado #221 and advised him of the incident. Det. Alvarado requested I provide [redacted] with his department issued cell phone number which I did.

On 12/02/2018 Ptl. Gordon #297 and I responded to [redacted] for a report of an overdose. Ptl. Caulfield #235, Ptl. LaRocca #239, and Brick Police EMS were on scene prior to our arrival. Ptl. LaRocca was able to locate the overdose victim, [redacted] and escort him to the ambulance. We met with [redacted] outside of [redacted] as he was being evaluated by EMS.

[redacted] told us that between 08:30 AM and approximately 11:32 AM he used "four or five bags of heroin." He also stated that he purchased the heroin from a person in Patterson NJ yesterday before arriving at his parents house, [redacted], to visit. [redacted] did not know the name of the person that he purchased the heroin from but he did say that he would be willing to provide information to a DEU detective. [redacted] was then transported to Ocean Medical Center by EMS.

Ptl. Gordon and I then spoke with [redacted] father. [redacted] advised us that he thought that [redacted] was in the shower too long and he wanted to check on him. When he opened the door to the bathroom he was able to see [redacted] slumped over sitting on the toilet. When he entered the bathroom he was able to see multiple bags of heroin and a syringe on the counter. He began attempting to wake [redacted] but [redacted] was displaying the symptoms of a heroin overdose. [redacted] stepmother, [redacted] also attempted to wake [redacted] with negative results. [redacted] then administered one dose of narcan. After receiving the narcan, [redacted] became alert and conscious.

After speaking to [redacted] and [redacted] Ptl. Gordon and I began to search the bathroom and bedroom for additional contraband. One used and one unused wax fold stamped "New Arrival" and five syringes were located in the bedroom inside [redacted] bag. Ptl. Caulfield provided us with approximately nine to ten more wax folds that he retrieved on [redacted] person prior to our arrival. The wax folds were logged and entered into evidence for destruction and the syringes were disposed of at Ocean Medical Center. While at headquarters Ptl. Gordon contacted Det. Alvarado #221 of the DEU and advised him of the incident. Det. Alvarado advised that he would not be responding but requested his contact information be left with [redacted] Ptl. Gordon and I then responded to Ocean Medical Center and provided [redacted] with said information.

On 12-02-2018 at approximately 0135 hours Sergeant Bartolucci #183, Patrolman Dinnebeil #268 and I (Patrolman Alexander #216) responded to [redacted] for a report of an unconscious 28 year old female that was breathing.

Upon arrival I was met at the front door by a male subject, later identified as [redacted] advised me he believed his sister, [redacted], overdosed. [redacted] led me into the kitchen of his residence, where I observed [redacted] sitting on the floor and slumped over. [redacted] was unconscious and had agonal breathing. Patrolman Dinnebeil and I were preparing to administer Narcan to [redacted] but Brick Township Medical Unit #538, members Hearon #5384 and Bloomer #53107, arrived on scene and took over medical treatment for [redacted]. Also Paramedics Johnson #3374 and Shkarofsky #3931 assisted in [redacted] treatment.

I then spoke with [redacted]. He stated his sister arrived at his residence earlier to visit and spend the night. [redacted] stated that [redacted] had told him she took some muscle relaxers and was going to bed, which was in the basement of the residence. [redacted] stated he went in the basement to check on her a short time after and he observed her half on the bed and half on the floor. [redacted] stated his sister has overdosed several times from opiate drugs. [redacted] stated when he saw her condition he picked her up, brought her upstairs and called the police, believing she overdosed.

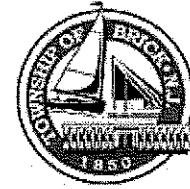
I spoke with #538 member Hearon, who advised me she believed [redacted] overdosed from some type of opiate drug, due to her condition and her reaction to Narcan that they administered to her.

A check of the area where [redacted] was in the basement checked negative for any drugs or drug use. [redacted] was subsequently transported to Brick Hospital for further treatment.

I gave Detective Alvarado #221 (Brick Township's Drug Unit) the information surrounding this incident.

The caller, _____ advised he found his son _____) overdosed on heroin and was unresponsive in the bathroom. _____ had then administered one 4mg dose of narcan that he had purchased at the pharmacy. After a short time _____ continued to be unresponsive and his father administered a second dose of narcan.

Officers shortly arrived on scene with EMS and medics. BTPD EMS 536 took over care of the victim. In the bathroom alerted me of a hypodermic needle that his son used to inject the heroin. On _____ person we located 2 bundles (20 bags) of wax folds stamped "Total Control" with a seal in green color. Also on his person was a blue bottle cap with white powder residue. EMS transported _____ to Ocean Medical Center for further evaluation.

All items secured at the scene were lodged into evidence in locker 3 per departmental policy. Detective Nixon #209 of BTPD Drug Enforcement Unit was notified of the incident and would not be responding to the hospital.

On 11/20/18 at approximately 2145 hours Ptl. Williams #220, Ptl. Finelli #273 and I responded to [redacted], Lukoil Gas Station, in reference to an overdose. Dispatch advised they received a call from a taxi driver advising a male subject was possibly overdosing in the back seat.

Upon arrival we located the taxi (NJ reg. B48KCA) and the male subject, [redacted], who was in the back seat. [redacted] appeared disoriented and was nodding in and out of consciousness. Ptl. Williams began to speak with [redacted] who advised him that he was under the influence of heroin. Brick Police EMS arrived on scene and began to assess

I spoke with the taxi driver, [redacted], who advised me of the following:

A few minutes prior he had picked up [redacted] from the Lakewood bus terminal and was transporting him to an address off of Hooper Ave. While en-route [redacted] asked him to stop at the Lukoil gas station in order to purchase him gas. After stopping at the gas station [redacted] exited the vehicle and went into the bathroom. A short time later [redacted] got back into the vehicle without purchasing any gas and they began to drive away. Prior to exiting the lot he observed [redacted] go unconscious while in the back seat and he immediately contacted 9-11.

While on scene Ptl. Finelli searched the bathroom and located an empty wax fold ("Anaconda" in green print) and a used syringe. Ptl. Williams conducted a search of [redacted] which revealed two additional wax folds with the same stamp containing suspect heroin. Ptl. Williams also located a bag of syringes which were unused. All CDS and paraphernalia were collected and placed into property via Aegis. [redacted] as transported to Ocean Medical Center by Brick Police EMS for further treatment.

Detective Nixon #209 of the Drug Enforcement Unit was contacted and notified of the incident.

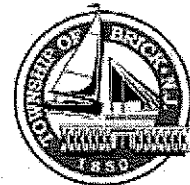

On 11/17/18 at approximately 1510 hours Ptl. Firreno #283 and I, Ptl. Carter #280 responded to [redacted] or an overdose.

Upon arrival we were escorted to an upstairs bathroom where [redacted] was lying on the floor with agonal breathing. He was unresponsive to attempts to wake him and sternum rubs. [redacted] breathing continued to become more labored as time went on. [redacted] has used heroin in the past, however he was clean for several months up to this point. Ptl. Firreno administered a narcan dose in the nostril and we were joined by MONOC Paramedics along with Brick EMS. First aid was administered and after a short period [redacted] regained consciousness and his breathing returned to normal. [redacted] advised he used heroin prior to police arrival via a syringe which was recovered under his body. [redacted] flushed the wax folds down the toilet and the only information provided was that it was yellow fold with no stamp. [redacted] acquired the heroin from Patterson at a prior time.

I also made contact with the caller, [redacted] who advised me of the following:
Earlier today he left the house around 1200 hours when he last saw [redacted] After being out of the house for a short period he responded home around 1500 hours. He began looking for [redacted] inside the residence and ultimately found him in the upstairs bedroom. Emergency services were then called.

I contacted Detective Mauro #207 in reference to the matter and he will follow up at a later date. [redacted] as transported to Ocean Medical Center by Brick EMS M538. The recovered syringes were placed into property to be destroyed and all Narcan forms were completed.

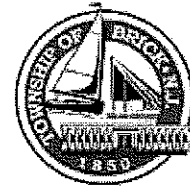

On our arrival BTPD First Aid was already on the scene and they had deployed one unit of Narcan to the female patient due to her suddenly going unconscious in front of them. The patient's husband, [redacted] was on location and he stated that he believed that his wife, [redacted] had accidentally overdosed on her own prescription medication. She had just had oral surgery and was prescribed Percoset for the pain, but her regular dentist had prescribed her Tylenol 3 for the pain leading up to the oral surgery and after. [redacted] also takes other medication for Bi-Polar and Multiple Sclerosis, Hydrocodone and Klonopin.

[redacted] was transported to the Ocean County Medical Center for medical treatment. We checked [redacted] medication bottles and the pills taken appeared normal except for the Hydrocodone. There were 14 pills missing when there should have been 12 taken by this date.

On 11/1/2018 at 2311 hours, Ptl. Zurica #242, Ptl. DeMaio #194 and I were dispatched to the parking lot of 570 Rt. 70, Target. Police Dispatch advised a worker from Target, [redacted] advised there was a suspicious vehicle in the parking lot with a white male subject yelling from it. [redacted] described the vehicle to Police Dispatch as a Silver Chevrolet Impala.

Upon arrival, I located a silver Chevrolet Impala, bearing New Jersey Registration L98JTR, parked in the parking lot with a white male subject standing outside of it on the driver's side. The vehicle had the driver's side door ajar as I pulled up to it. When I exited my vehicle the male subject that was standing outside of the vehicle, later identified as [redacted], asked me for help with his friend. I approached the driver's side of the vehicle and observed a white male subject, later identified as [redacted] unconscious in the driver's seat. As I attempted to wake [redacted] asked [redacted] what happened to [redacted] prior to my arrival. [redacted] stated that he did not know but [redacted] picked him up at this residence in Brick and they went to Target. As [redacted] parked the vehicle in the parking lot, [redacted] started acting "strange."

Due to [redacted] being unconscious and unresponsive and I was unable to see his chest rise, to indicate he was breathing, I checked his radial for a pulse. I was able to feel a rapid pulse and observed [redacted] to be breathing. I then asked [redacted] if [redacted] partakes in controlled dangerous substance. [redacted] advised [redacted] has in the past. I checked [redacted] pupils and observed them to be "pin pointed" which is indicative of a subject who is under the influence of heroin.

I went back to my vehicle to obtain my department issued Naloxone. I administered the Naloxone into [redacted] left nostril. A short time after administering the Naloxone, [redacted] started to wake. I advised [redacted] I was there to help him and needed to know what he ingested or injected himself with to better help him. [redacted] advised he injected himself with heroin. I asked [redacted] how much and he stated only one.

Ptl. DeMaio, Ptl. Zurica and Sgt. Matthews arrived on scene to assist. Brick Police EMS along with Monoc also arrived on scene to treat [redacted]

After Brick Police EMS completed [redacted] vitals they advised him they were going to transport him to Ocean Medical Center for further treatment. Brick Police EMS had [redacted] exit the vehicle. As [redacted] exited the vehicle an empty small white wax fold with the stamp "BEST BUY" in black color on it was one the driver's seat. I asked [redacted] if he had or if there was any more heroin/needles inside his vehicle. [redacted] stated, "No." I searched [redacted] prior to him being put on the EMS stretcher. In [redacted] wallet I located three white wax folds containing the same "BEST BUY" stamp on it. Two of the wax folds were unused while one was empty. I then searched the vehicle and located used needle in the center console.

Police Dispatch was giving [redacted] and [redacted] information and advised to check them for valid driver's licenses along with any active warrants. Police Dispatch advised both were negative for active warrants and also both had suspended New Jersey Driver's licenses.

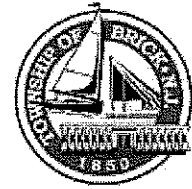
Due to [redacted] admission to him driving from [redacted] residence to the Target I issued him two summonses. I issued motor vehicle summons for suspended driver's license, 39:3-40, E18 004177 and a motor vehicle summons for failure to inspect, 39:8-1, E18 004178.

[redacted] was transported to Ocean Medical Center by Brick Police EMS without incident for further treatment.

I collected all evidence and brought them to Police Headquarters where I entered all evidence into property. I contacted the on call DEU Detective, Alvarado #221, to advise him of the overdose. I completed a Naloxone replenishment form along with the NJ Attorney General's Heroin & Opiates Task Force Naloxone Administration Reporting Form, Ocean County.

On 10/28/2018, at 2211 hours, Ptl Lardieri #251, Ptl Oliverio #286, and I (Ptl. Mesmer #292) were dispatched to [redacted] for a reported overdose. Upon our arrival on scene, I observed a white male, later identified as [redacted], seated on a couch in the living room breathing agonally with pin point pupils. [redacted] was pale, unconscious, diaphoretic, and breathing approximately 4-6 times per minute. Based on the symptoms that [redacted] presented, I recognized them to be consistent with those of an opiate overdose. [redacted] mother, identified as [redacted] was on location and advised units that [redacted] did in fact have a previous history with opiate abuse, specifically heroin [redacted] stated that she was the caller and she was upstairs when she heard what she described as someone struggling to breath and snorting. She came downstairs and found her son unconscious seated on the couch which is when she called police.

Brick Police EMS unit 534 arrived on location simultaneously with patrol units and began to render first aid to [redacted] EMS administered one (1) 4mg dose of Narcan intra nasally and began to ventilate [redacted] utilizing a bag valve mask. After approximately 3 minutes, [redacted] regained consciousness. [redacted] stated that he had picked up two or three wax folds of heroin from a friend of his, who he would not identify, earlier in the night. [redacted] then came home and snorted the heroin. [redacted] had two empty wax folds in his pocket that were stamped in green writing with the word "Obsession". [redacted] also had a plastic ball that opened and in the center was a wax like substance which he described as a "Dab". Both the wax folds and the ball containing the wax like substance were taken into evidence and placed into property for destruction as per department policy.

[redacted] was ultimately transported by EMS to Ocean Medical Center for further treatment. Det Nixon #209 of the Brick Police DEU was notified of the incident.
